

## Colorado Emergency Watershed Protection (EWP) Program Local Cost Share Requirements

The Colorado Water Conservation Board (CWCB) is the State's sponsor for the EWP program administered by the Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS). The EWP program provides financial and technical assistance to local project sponsors to install flooding and erosion recovery measures to protect life and property, such as protecting destabilized stream banks and repairing conservation practices, among others.

## **EWP** Project Implementation Cost Share

- 75% NRCS
- 12.5% State of Colorado Disaster Emergency Fund
- **12.5% Local Sponsor** (i.e. watershed coalition, city, county)

## Local Sponsor Cost Share May Be

- 1. Cash
- 2. In-kind contribution
- 3. Any combination of cash and in-kind contribution

Local cost share must be identified and committed <u>prior</u> to the project beginning. However, costs must be incurred after the project's Financial Assistance Agreement is signed by the NRCS. Retain records to document costs incurred for in-kind match contribution.
